

POST OP INSTRUCTIONS – GENERAL HAND SURGERY

- ____ Keep hand and arm elevated most of the time. ____ Use ice pack over the affected area.
- The numbness from the surgical anesthetic usually lasts about 6 hours, although it could be longer.
- Wear splint: _____While sleeping _____when up & about ____at all times. ______No splint
- Bandage: ____ Do not remove bandage ____ You may remove bandage on post op day ___.
- PT/OT: ____ Not ordered ____ Will be ordered at post op appointment ____ Has been ordered as follows:
- Motion: ____ Move fingers freely ____ No lifting over 2 lbs ____ Don't lift anything with affected hand.
- If you had surgery on your dominant hand, writing will be very difficult, don't push it.
- Do not use over the counter salves, Neosporin, Bacitracin, or other ointments on the wound. Hands and fingers sweat and the wound will get macerated and open up.
- Band aids are ok, but make sure to let the incision "breathe" as it will heal much faster with air.
- Any redness, increased heat, and of course anything that looks like an infection requires that you call us to be evaluated.
- You may have been given a prescription for pain medication. This should be taken as directed by your physician.
